ONE CASE FIVE DISEASES

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Myasthenia Gravis (MG) is an autoimmune disorder affecting neuromuscular junction. Its occurrence with other autoimmune disease is common, although concurrence with mixt connective tissue disorders has been rarely reported. In this paper we provided a short story of a patient who has refractory MG and five other different diseases (epilepsy, migraine, rheumatic heart disease, raynaud phenomenon, and hypothyroidism) in addition to Sjögren's syndrome and who became able to perform daily activities after receiving plasmapheresis (PLEX) once a month for 9 months and IVIG 0.4 mg/kg/day every other week for 3 months.
