

TBI MANAGEMENT – CLASSIC APPROACHES

Traumatic brain injury remains one of the most frequent causes of neurological sequelae and death in young people worldwide. Unfortunately, such a brutal aggression on brain tissue do not have a spectacular treatment yet, and classical approaches, focused on surgical removal of clots which increase ICP, decrease of brain oedema, monitoring of systemic and brain homeostasis and addressing complications, which are frequent, are the established standards of clinical intervention. However, neuroprotection concept seems promising and new clinical studies are worthy. In my paper, I will review the classical approach of TBI management, based on the current diagnosis and treatment criteria.
