Leonidas Stefanis is Professor of Neurology and Neurobiology at the Medical School of the University of Athens, Director of the Second Department of Neurology at "Attikon" Hospital, and collaborating investigator at the Foundation of Biomedical Research of the Academy of Athens (BRFAA), where he leads a research group working on Neurodegenerative Diseases. More specifically, his research involves the genetic basis of Parkinson's Disease and related disorders, the mechanisms of neurotoxicity evoked by aberrant alpha-synuclein, as well as the pathogenic effects of genetic alterations in other genes linked to Parkinson's Disease. He has co-authored more than 100 publications in high-impact journals, he has received funding from various national and international funding sources, and he has served as member of the Editorial Board of important journals in the area of Neurobiology, as well as of committees of evaluation of research proposals, such as the European Research Council.
